Artists used to draw cartoons mainly on boards and put them up at public places for everyone to see and enjoy. Later with the advent of printing machines and newspapers cartooning flourished all over the world. Initially cartoons were drawn as a protest and to create public awareness against all kinds of social and religious injustices, but from the middle of 19th century cartoon became a major source of entertainment by branching off into new directions like comics , illustrations and animation films.Cartooning started in India by the British rulers before the Indians took over and created a rich tradition of Indian cartoons.During the beginning of 20th century,Kolkata became the centrestage of cartoon culture with Gaganendranath Tagore taking a major role. There were at least half a dozen Bengali magazines which could boast of publishing quality cartoons regularly. Names like P,C.L., Chandi Lahiri and Amol became household names. Today although Newspapers seemed to have lost interest in publishing cartoons , cartoonists are getting more and more engaged in the flourishing buisness of Animation films. A very bright future is waiting for someone with original ideas and drawing skill Going for a cartooning or animation course in any reputed Institution can be extremely benifitting.With the increasing awareness and interest in taking up cartooning either as a hobby or a profession the next & old generation of talented artists can revive the glorious period of cartoon culture in our country.
